 - Wesley Hedden, Quality of Life Chair (Peace Studies and Sociology) commented that he & his wife are both graduate

students with two children. The cost of childcare for one child is almost one of their stipends

- Extra policies for family support are in the works, including vision
- Agus Fiorani (Anthropology) asked question regarding housing
 - We have a couple things in the works
 - Adding buildings up by The Landings for cost of Fischer Graduate Residences
 - Other discussions about housing downtown
 - The University is very aware of the housing issue for grad students
 - Whatever is build next needs to be affordable for grad students
- Tatiana Rosales, DEI Chair (Chemistry and Biochemistry) asked How do you envision getting the University back to a research institution?
 - Lots of cultural change
 - When faculty think about what's best for students as well as what's best for their lab
 - Envisions supplemental stipends for central funding for research for international internships for areas with higher cost of living
- Adedoyin Okanlawon (Psychology) is interested in negotiating for a stipend higher than what is given with the Notebaert fellowship if a student receives an external grant.
 - We're not good at getting external grants for our graduate students. Northwestern grad students get 5% more.
- Theo encouraged students to meet with Mike, saying he's fantastic to work with

 - Montana Carlozo (Chemical & Biomolecular Engineering) made motion to approve
 - Pranav Nalamwar (Physics) seconded the motion
